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# **Course Description**

This course is designed as a comprehensive study of world history topics. Students will use inquiry to explore a variety of people, events, and movements in world history. Students will analyze the impact of social, geographic, political, and economic influences on historical events. The course includes a balanced approach to the Eastern and Western Hemispheres including a study of the peoples of Africa, the Americas, Asia, and Europe. To allow for depth of content and connection to current issues and events, the course begins in the 15<sup>th</sup> century and ends with contemporary global issues.

# **Classroom Expectations**

Expectations for myself will be to always see you as a human, first. I want you all to know I care about you and the experiences you carry with you and make you who you are. Your experiences will help us find connections to our daily lives in what we are learning throughout this history course. I am so excited to get to know you and for the opportunity to be a positive experience of your learning journey!

During this course, one goal is to help you encounter varying perspectives, question who is telling the story and who benefits from that telling. Another goal is to facilitate your finding of the human connections that can help us better understand context for why events happened and what happened because of how they were handled. My hope is that you will find value in asking questions and where that can lead our collective and individual learning.

When we reach the end of our time together, my hope is that you will have felt success in being reflective learners who see value and opportunities for learning in all situations. Being willing to learn helps all of us to go down the path of being good people who understand that everyone and everything has a story to learn.

#### **Classroom Routines**

#### **Smiles and Frowns**

The first five or so minutes will be a time for students to evaluate where they are in their day and to develop empathy with what is happening in other's lives. A simple designation of

Smiling/Frowning/Pass will help our classes, over time, develop a positive classroom culture. I learned this activity from Monte Syrie, an English teacher I follow who teaches in Washington.

#### **Priorities/Goals**

Throughout the year the students will be developing their understanding of developing priorities and goals for specific class periods, for the week, or for work that needs to be completed in a time outside of class.

#### Instruction/Class Work Time

There will be a mixture of whole group, small group or individual sessions for instruction. Mr. Wince will schedule these times so that everyone will know what will be happening in order to better schedule their time.

# **End of Class Recap/Reminders of Deadlines**

The last couple of minutes of class there will be a time to allow for students to visit their priorities/goals and evaluate if work is needed to be completed outside of class. This time will also be used to make sure students are prepared to move to their next class.

# **Weekly Reflections**

Each week I will ask you to complete a Weekly Reflection to document your thinking from the weeks worth of activities and interactions.

# **Evaluation of Learning**

I value learning and want to create an environment that allows for you to be creative risk takers and collaborative learners. Feedback on demonstrations of learning will be prioritized to focus our learning.

You will be asked to participate in the Common Formative Assessments (CFAs) and Unit Assessments that all the World History teachers in the Marcos de Niza Social Studies Department will be giving. These will help guide our understanding of what is being understood and what we will need to continue to work towards.

Reflections will be used as a piece of evidence of learning throughout the units and guarters.

## **Grading Policy**

- Quarter Grades are based on a traditional 10-point scale:
  A = 90% or higher / B = 80-89% / C = 70-79% / D = 60-69% / F = 59%-50%
- 2. Semester grades are determined by combining the two individual quarter percentages with the final exam grade. (Semester Grade: 80% and Final Exam: 20%)
